Manor has a long history of Listed Building Development and is currently working on two projects in Hull.

Outlined below are examples of our experience.

9 Castle Hill, Lincoln



Tudor building circa 1543

Formerly the head office of Manor Property Group between 1992 and 1998; currently Lincoln Information Centre

The property was refurbished using traditional materials including horse hair plaster.

Steep Hill, Lincoln

Relocated the Wig and Pen Public House from a Listed Building to an antique warehouse which won an award for conservation.

Preserving an example of tongue and groove partitioning circa 1700; now on display within a first floor restaurant.

Worswick Chambers, Newcastle

Refurbished the exterior to bring the property back into become commercially viable; now let to an office user.

Hydraulic Tower and Pump House, Saint Andrews Quay, Hull

Currently working with English Heritage, Butlers a CBE member conservation architect, the Local Authority and Hull University to create an educational facility, respecting the architectural integrity.

Lord Line Building, Hull

Locally Listed.

Saved from demolition to create a head office facility for a 21st century social network company.

Joseph Rank Mill, Clarence Street, Hull

Regionally Listed

Working with Hull Civic Society and the Museum of Hull to commemorate the first mill built by Joseph rank, which was badly bombed during the war.
